Q & A's about the Association

What does the Association do?

The Association primarily oversees upkeep of the the front entrance area, interfaces with governmental units, helps to resolve neighborhood issues and works to develop a sense of community for all who live here.

What do you use the membership dues for?

The majority of your annual dues go to maintain the front entrance area, also mailing and printing costs for the Annual meeting notification, and well as website hosting. Take a look at the 2018 Expenses, included with this packet, for more details.

Who clears the snow on the roads?

Maintenance of the roads in Ravenwood Forest (except the private ones) are performed by DOT. They alone are responsible for clearing the snow and ice. The Association contacts DOT to add Ravenwood Forest to their schedule.

Who removes fallen/leaning trees near or on the roads?

Again, the Association contacts DOT if there is not a safety issue, otherwise the Henderson County public safety dept. needs to be notified. As for leaning trees, it all depends on whose property the tree is on. Right now we have a large leaning tree in the front area, but it appears to be on private property, therefore, it is the responsibility of the respective property owner.

What can I do to help this neighborhood?

In order to be more effective, we need you to become a paid member of the Association, which entitles you to have a voice and vote on all issue affecting this community. Also volunteering in some capacity is great, right now we need individuals to serve on the Social group: planning a get-together BBQ or such, a good way to meet your neighbors. Of course, we would also be delighted to have you volunteer in whatever works for your available time and interests.
